Kindergarten Enrollment Requirements

To enroll in our Kindergarten program, your child must be born between December 3, 2004 and December 2, 2005, Please complete the enrollment forms and bring the following:

- Parent/Legal Guardian must show proper photo |.D.
- Child must be present.
- Immunization card (immunization must be up-to-date with TB test showing results within one year and Hepatitis B)
- Birth Certificate, Baptism Certificate, or Passport
- Proof of address: (gas bill, DWP bill, rent contract). We **DO NOT** accept telephone bills or cable bills.

Para inscribir en Kinder su hijo tiene que haber nacido entre el 3 de diciembre del 2004 y 2 de diciembre del 2005. Por favor, complete las formas de matriculación y traigan los documentos siguientes:

- Padres/Guardianes con custodia legal deben presentar su tarjeta de identificación al momento de matricular o registrar al estudiante.
- Su hijo
- Tarjeta de vacunas (con todas las vacunas al corriente, enseñando el resultado de la tuberculosis sin pasar un año y la Hepatitis B)
- Acta de nacimiento, Certificado de Bautizo o Pasaporte
- Prueba de domicilio (recibo de gas, electricidad, o contrato de la renta) **NO** se aceptan recibos de teléfono

GUIDE TO THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE CALIFORNIA SCHOOL IMMUNIZATION LAW FOR Grade K-12

INSTRUCTIONS Post this guide on a Wall or desktop as quick reference to help you determine if children seeking admission to your school meet California's School immunization requirements. If you have any questions, call the Immunization Coordinator at your local health department

IMMUNIZATION To enter or transfer into public and private elementary and secondary school (grades kindergarten through 12), children under age 18 years must have immunization as outlined below. New 7 grade entry requirements will go into effect 7/1/99.

VACCINE

REQUIRED DOSES

Polio (OPV and/or IPV) 4 doses at any age, but...4 doses meet requirement for ages 4-6 years if at least one was given on or after the 4th birthday; 3 doses meet requirement for ages 7-17 years if at least one was given on or after the 2nd birthday.

Diphtheria, Tetanus, and Pertussis

Age 6 years and under (Pertussis is required)..... 5 doses at any age, but...4 doses meet requirement for ages 4-6 years DTP, DTaP or any combination of DTP or if at least one was on or after the 4th birthday. DTaP with DT (diphtheria and tetanus)

Age 7 years and older (Pertussis is not required) 4 doses at any age, but...3 doses meet requirement for ages 7-17 year Td, DT, or DTP, DTaP or any combination if at least one was on or after the 2nd birthday. If last dose was given these before the 2nd birthday, one more (Td) dose is required.

7th grade, effective 7/1/99.....* 1 dose not required but recommended if more than 5 years have TD booster passed since last DTP, DTaP, or Td dose.

Measles, Mumps, Rubella (MMR)

Kindergarten 2 doses- Both on or after 1st birthday
*7th Grade, effective 7/1/99** 2 doses - Both on or after 1st birthday
Grade 1-6 and 8-12 1 dose- Must be on or after the 1st birthday

Hepatitis B

Kindergarten 3 doses
7th grade, Effective 7/1/99 3 doses

Varicella

Kindergarten 1 dose
1 dose for children under 13 years; 2 doses are needed if immunized on or after 13th birthday.

1. Receipt of the dose up to (and including) 4 days before the birthday will satisfy the school entry immunization requirement.
2. Two doses of measles-containing vaccine required. One dose of mumps and rubella-containing vaccine required, mumps vaccine is not required for children 7 years of age and older.
3. Two doses of the 2-dose hepatitis B vaccine formulation along with provider documentation that the 2-dose hepatitis B vaccine formulation was used for both doses and both doses were received at age 11-15 years will also fulfill this requirement.
4. Physician-documented Varicella (chicken pox) disease history or immunity meets the varicella requirement.

EXEMPTIONS: The law allows (a) parents/guardians to choose an exemptions from immunizations requirements based on their personal beliefs, and (b) physicians of children to elect medical exemptions. The law does not allow parents /guardians to elect an exemption simply because of inconvenience (a record is lost or incomplete and it is too much trouble to go to a physician or clinic to correct the problem.) See back of the blue California School immunization Record (PM 286) for instructions and the affidavit to be signed by parents /guardians electing the personal beliefs exemption. For children with medical exemptions, the physician's written statement should be stapled to the CSIR. Schools should maintain an up-to date list of pupils with exemptions, so they can be excluded quickly if an outbreak occurs.
